## GENERAL REGISTRATION INFORMATION

1. Proper registration is important. It is the responsibility of the student and parent/guardian to check graduation requirements & course descriptions carefully. Counselors are available for consultation.
2. Each student must register for a full eight period schedule for both semesters. Further, students are required to select two alternate classes. After registration, changes must be approved by the parents and the counselor. **A \$10.00 fee will be assessed to change class schedules.**
3. Some classes listed in this course guide may not be offered if minimum enrollment requirements are not met.
4. Students who desire to take religious instruction (release time/bible study) may do so on a non-credit basis.
5. Students desiring early graduation should declare their intent to their counselor immediately to provide adequate planning time.
6. Weber School District and its individual schools will not be responsible for transporting or arranging for the transport of students who elect to take classes at schools other than their own school where they are registered. The parent/guardian of such students will be solely responsible for the transport of their students to and from each school.

## WEBER SCHOOL DISTRICT POLICIES

### FEE SCHEDULE

In accordance with Utah State Law, the Weber School District Board of Education annually reviews all fees charged to students for various activities, classes, yearbooks, etc. This information will be published and made available to parents prior to the time of registration in the fall. ### FEE WAIVERS

No student will be denied the opportunity to participate in school activities and educational programs because of the inability to pay fees, deposits, or other charges. Students and/or parents who need assistance should contact the administrator over fee waivers for assistance.

# CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT AND EARLY COLLEGE

**EARLY COLLEGE** – Application process – must meet with a counselor. Application and agreement forms must be signed by student and parents.

## CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT

- If you are a Junior or Senior, possess a desire to seek **challenging, rigorous educational opportunities** for both high school and college credit, then you may be interested in registering for concurrent enrollment credit.
- It is expected that students will have the necessary background and meet the academic requirements to demonstrate success in concurrent enrollment courses. It is required that concurrent enrollment students have at least a **3.0 cumulative GPA. Appropriate exceptions will be handled on a case by case basis.**
- Some institutions may require **minimum ACT or Accuplacer scores** in addition to the minimum 3.0 GPA before enrollment at the university or for specific courses.
- Universities require **90% attendance** or better in all concurrent enrollment courses.
- Students will be responsible to **purchase** any required books, outline, and/or supplies as required by the university.
- All post-secondary institutions charge a **one-time application fee**. Payment of this fee is the responsibility of the student.
- Dropping a concurrent enrollment course is not advisable. If you choose to drop the course after the university deadline, a "W" will be given on your permanent college transcript and may affect your future college endeavors.
- The **grade** you earn in any concurrent enrollment course will become part of your **permanent high school transcript as well as your college transcript.**
- **College credit** for concurrent enrollment is not guaranteed from year to year. It is determined by the university as to which courses and instructors qualify to offer the credit.

**Please check with the CTE Coordinator or your counselor if you have any questions regarding concurrent enrollment courses and the status of the class.** It is important to remember that concurrent enrollment should be in line with your CCR, college, and career goals.

*Please note the possibility that some CE classes offered at the time of printing the course guide may not end up being eligible for CE Credit at a later date. A class may be eligible for Concurrent Enrollment pending curriculum and instructor approval by post-secondary institutions and the course being included on the USOE Concurrent Enrollment Master List. This approval is granted on a year-to-year basis.*

REGISTERING FOR A CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT CLASS AT BONNEVILLE HIGH DOES NOT AUTOMATICALLY MAKE YOU A WSU STUDENT, NOR REGISTER YOU IN THE WSU CLASS.

You will receive information with your final report card regarding the upcoming school year, again in the mail, and when you pick up your high school schedules in August.

After registering for a Concurrent Enrollment Course through BHS, you will apply for admission into WSU, at the following Concurrent Enrollment Website Step I: <https://continue.weber.edu/concurrentenrollment>

There is a one time application fee of \$30.

Once you receive your acceptance email/letter into WSU, you will need to register through WSU's Concurrent Enrollment Website, there is a \$5.00 charge per credit hour: <https://continue.weber.edu/concurrentenrollment> All your information will be in your High School registration packet in August.

**BE SURE TO COMPLETE THE WSU ENROLLMENT AND REGISTRATION BEFORE THE WSU DEADLINE OR YOU WILL NOT GET COLLEGE CREDIT.**

- EARN 27.00 CREDITS, INCLUDING 18.5 CREDITS OF STATE/DISTRICT CORE AND 8.5. CREDITS FROM ELECTIVE COURSES.** \* CAREER ASSESSMENT AND GUIDANCE IS OFFERED TO STUDENTS TO ASSIST THEM IN DESIGNING A COURSE OF STUDY THAT WILL MEET THEIR INDIVIDUAL NEEDS. ALL STUDENTS ARE ENCOURAGED TO ENROLL IN COURSES WHICH PROVIDE FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF SPECIFIC JOB SKILLS, PREPARE THEM FOR POST-HIGH SCHOOL EDUCATION, AND PROVIDE ENRICHMENT TO LIFE

## FLEX RESTRICTION

SOME STUDENTS WILL BE ON FLEX RESTRICTION IF THEY HAVE MORE THAN ONE F IN A CORE CLASS OR LESS THAN A 2.0 GPA. STUDENTS MEETING THIS CRITERIA WILL BE PLACED IN A STUDY HALL CLASS DESIGNED TO HELP THEM RESTORE LOST CREDIT AND LEARN SKILLS TO BE A SUCCESSFUL STUDENT. ONCE THE CREDIT IS MADE UP AND STUDENTS HAVE IMPROVED THEIR GPA, THEY WILL BE ALLOWED TO CHOOSE A DIFFERENT FLEX OPTION.

## ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS: 1.0 LA10, 1.0 LA11, 1.0 LA4 (ELECTIVE) CREDITS



ENROLL IN ENGLISH EACH YEAR OF HIGH SCHOOL. BEGINNING IN THE TENTH GRADE, ENGLISH ELECTIVES MAY BE TAKEN FOR THE 12<sup>TH</sup> GRADE ENGLISH REQUIREMENT.

### **ENGLISH 10 CP (52510)**

Designed to help students improve basic English skills (reading, writing, speaking, listening).

NO FEE 10<sup>TH</sup> GRADE 1.0 LA10 CREDIT (YEAR)

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### **ENGLISH 10 HONORS (52610)**

A survey of World Literature highlighting cultural similarities and differences. Focus is on analytical reading and writing. Generally, two pieces read per term and corresponding papers written. Access to and use of a computer are imperative.

NO FEE 10<sup>TH</sup> GRADE 1.0 LA10 CREDIT (YEAR)

PRE-REQUISITE: TEACHER APPROVAL

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### **ENGLISH 11 CP (52520)**

Designed to help students improve basic English skills (reading, writing, speaking, listening). Emphasis on American literature. Some ACT preparation included.

NO FEE 11<sup>TH</sup> GRADE 1.0 LA11 CREDIT (YEAR)

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### **ENGLISH 11 HONORS (52620)**

Focus on analytical reading of classic American literature and writing. Generally, two pieces read per term and a variety of papers written. Access to and use of a computer is imperative. Some ACT preparation included.

NO FEE 11<sup>TH</sup> GRADE 1.0 LA11 CREDIT (YEAR)

PRE-REQUISITE: TEACHER APPROVAL

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### **ENGLISH 11 – AP ENGLISH LANGUAGE (52627)**

Engages students in becoming skilled readers of texts and in becoming skilled writers who compose for a variety of purposes. Both their writing and their reading should make students aware of the interactions among a writer's purposes, audience expectations, and subjects, as well as the way English language conventions contribute to the effectiveness of writing. Emphasis on informational text and non-fiction.

APPROX. \$92 FOR THE SPRING AP TEST 11<sup>TH</sup> GRADE 1.0 LA11 CREDIT (YEAR)

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### **ENGLISH 12 CP (52530)**

Designed to help students improve basic English skills (reading, writing, speaking, listening). Writing emphasis for effective college and workplace communication. Some British literature will be covered.

NO FEE 12<sup>TH</sup> GRADE 1.0 LA ELECTIVE CREDIT (YEAR)

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### **AP ENGLISH LITERATURE AND COMPOSITION (52630)**

An AP English Literature and Composition course engages students in the careful reading and critical analysis of imaginative literature. Through the close reading of selected texts, students deepen their understanding of the ways writers use language to provide both meaning and pleasure for their readers. As they read, students consider a work's structure, style and themes, as well as such smaller-scale elements as the use of figurative language, imagery, symbolism and tone.

APPROX. \$92 FOR THE SPRING AP TEST 12<sup>TH</sup> GRADE 1.0 LA ELECTIVE CREDIT (YEAR)

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### **WSU ENGLISH 1010 (52420)**

1010 is a college course run through CANVAS and requires internet access for work submission. Students will focus on writing effective sentences and paragraphs and the writing process to include gathering credible research, synthesizing multiple sources, and proper documentation. Two major papers of 10-15 required. Must earn a C or better to receive college credit. Requires 90% attendance (*You may miss 5 class periods the entire semester regardless of circumstances. After that, one-half letter grade may be deducted from your final grade for each absence.*) **This is a SEMESTER course, but receives YR credit with passing grade both qtrs.**

12<sup>TH</sup> GRADE

1.0 LA ELECTIVE CREDIT (SEM)

PRE-REQUISITE: Students must have a 19 or higher on their ACT test scores in both Reading and English.

CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT OFFERED THROUGH WEBER STATE.

ENG 1010 - 3 CREDITS

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### **WSU ENGLISH 2010 (52422)**

English 2010 builds upon the skills developed in English 1010. The course provides instruction and practice in exposition, argumentation/persuasion, and documented research. It emphasizes critical thinking, the reciprocity of reading and writing, and the production of well-developed analytical arguments. Must earn a C or better to receive college credit. Requires 90% attendance (*You may miss 5 class periods the entire semester regardless of circumstances. After that, one-half letter grade may be deducted from your final grade for each absence.*) **This is a SEMESTER course, but receives YR credit with passing grade both qtrs.**

WSU CE FEES APPLY PLUS COLLEGE BOOK FEE

12<sup>TH</sup> GRADE

1.0 LA ELECTIVE CREDIT (SEM)

PRE-REQUISITE: Students must have successfully passed English 1010, received a 3, 4, or 5 on the AP English exam or scored an ACT score of 29 or higher in both English and Reading.

CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT OFFERED THROUGH WEBER STATE.

ENG 2010 - 3 CREDITS

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The following courses count for High School LA 4 Elective credit, but **MIGHT NOT COUNT** as 4<sup>th</sup> Year English Credit for some college admissions

### **WSU COMMUNICATIONS 2110 (52425)**

College course on interpersonal and small group communication. College-level writing and testing part of class curriculum. Students are responsible for WSU course textbook purchase. Requires 90% attendance (four absences per semester, regardless of the circumstances). **This is a SEMESTER course, but receives YR credit with passing grade both qtrs.**

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### **CREATIVE WRITING (52330F)**

In this class students will study the writing process in a variety of genres. They will also gain a more in-depth knowledge of literary devices that writers use to bring more life to their writing. Students will be writing extensively on a daily basis. This class **may not** be repeated.

**THIS CLASS WILL ONLY BE TAUGHT DURING THE FLEX PERIOD.**

10<sup>TH</sup>, 11<sup>TH</sup> OR 12<sup>TH</sup> GRADE

.50 LA ELECTIVE CREDIT (SEM)

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**JOURNALISM (52240)**

A rigorous newspaper production class wherein students work with an advisor to create a competition-worthy school newspaper. In this course, students will gain journalism skills such as: interviewing, writing, editing, layout design, photography, ad sales, as well as caption and headline writing. They will use these skills as they produce the school newspaper. Because of the production nature of the class, expectations are high and deadlines are strict.

10<sup>TH</sup>, 11<sup>TH</sup> OR 12<sup>TH</sup> GRADES

.50 LA ELECTIVE CREDIT (SEM)

**SPEECH & DEBATE (52270F)**

In this course students will develop fundamental skills in public speaking and argumentation. Students will join a competitive team and travel to tournaments throughout the area. Regular research, writing, and presentation projects will be assigned throughout the course.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS: 1.5 CREDITS

**PERFORMING ART COURSES – DANCE****BASIC DANCE (32240)**

This beginning dance course will focus on modern dance technique and developing physical strength, flexibility, endurance, and coordination. Students will expand their dance knowledge, skills, and vocabulary; they will learn about the history of dance, its cultural origins, and various types of dance (e.g., modern, hip-hop, lyrical, jazz, folk dance, etc.) Students will also develop their creative abilities through improvisation, choreography, and performance in small and large groups.

FEE \$10 PLUS PERFORMANCE ATTIRE

Students will support all activities scheduled in the school's theatre space. Students are required to work one of the two large main stage productions in addition to their after school hours. After school time will be required (approximately 20 hours per quarter). Students are expected to attend theatre performances outside of regularly scheduled class time and may be required to pay for these events.

Students should expect to leave the class with a strong knowledge of the art form of film and be able to express verbally and in writing quality analysis of the art form. Our discussions and assignments will naturally bleed into an understanding of all art forms, visual, performing etc. Students may be expected to attend film showings outside of regularly scheduled class time and may be required to pay for admission to these events.

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**VISUAL ART COURSES****ART FOUNDATIONS (32210)**

There is an emphasis on teaching the basic elements and principles of art. With an emphasis on making art, this course is designed to develop higher-level thinking, art-related thinking skills, art criticism, art history, and aesthetics. *No pre-requisite. This class should be taken before Painting and Drawing, or Sculpture.*

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## FOREIGN LANGUAGE

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS: NOT REQUIRED FOR GRADUATION

Students who are college-bound will want to complete two years of the same world language as recommended by the universities. University of Utah requires two years of world language for admissions.

### AMERICAN SIGN LANGUAGE 1 (35300)

A hands-on class that develops communication skills in American Sign Language. Students will learn how to appropriately communicate with a deaf person in a variety of situations, and will learn about deaf culture and history. Classes are conducted in ASL (no voicing is allowed), with a high emphasis on expressive skills.

NO FEE 10<sup>TH</sup>, 11<sup>TH</sup>, OR 12<sup>TH</sup> GRADE 1.0 ELECTIVE CREDIT (YEAR)

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### WSU ASL 1010 OR AMERICAN SIGN LANGUAGE 2 (35301)

This is an immersive conversation-based language class utilizing interactive contexts based on real-life every day conversation. We will build on the Level 1 vocabulary by utilizing it in more complex conversations. There will be several individual as well as partner projects. Cultural-appropriateness and developing more advanced communicative skills are a feature of this class. In order to achieve these goals, the class will participate in mandatory voice-off periods.

WSU CE FEES APPLY 11<sup>TH</sup> OR 12<sup>TH</sup> GRADE 1.0 ELECTIVE CREDIT OR L4 CR IF CE (YEAR)

PRE REQUISITE: ASL 1

CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT CREDIT OFFERED THROUGH WEBER STATE. ASL 1010—3 CREDITS

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### WSU ASL 1020 OR AMERICAN SIGN LANGUAGE 3 (35302)

This is an intensive conversation-based sign language class with greater opportunities for being involved in the Deaf Community. This is a "college-prep" / "career-prep" course where the ultimate goal is to consider interpreting as a career/Deaf education major. ASL grammar and structure will be explored in depth. In order to achieve these goals, the class with participate in mandatory voice-off periods.

WSU CE FEES APPLY 12<sup>TH</sup> GRADE 1.0 LA ELECTIVE CREDIT (YEAR)

PRE-REQUISITE: ASL 1 & 2

CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT CREDIT OFFERED THROUGH WEBER STATE. ASL 1020—3 CREDITS

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### CHINESE 1 (35260)

The focus is on speaking and understanding basic Chinese with an introduction to Chinese culture. The students will be able to communicate in topics such as self-introduction, ordering in restaurants, inquiring directions, etc. The goal is to promote professional, cultural and social development through a modern linguistic methodology.

NO FEE 10<sup>TH</sup>, 11<sup>TH</sup>, OR 12<sup>TH</sup> GRADE 1.0 ELECTIVE CREDIT (YEAR)

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### CHINESE 2 (35261)

This course continues to focus on speaking and understanding basic Chinese with additional cultural experiences. The students will be able to express their opinions about entertainment, food, lifestyles, etc. The goal is to promote professional, cultural, and social development through a modern linguistic methodology.

NO FEE 11<sup>TH</sup> OR 12<sup>TH</sup> GRADE 1.0 ELECTIVE CREDIT (YEAR)

PRE REQUISITE: CHINESE 1

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**CHINESE 3 (35262)**

This course continues to focus on speaking and understanding Chinese with additional cultural experiences. Students will be able to discuss topics such as traveling, fairy tales, traditional philosophy, etc. The goal is to promote professional, cultural and social development through a modern linguistic methodology.

NO FEE 12<sup>TH</sup> GRADE 1.0 LA ELECTIVE CREDIT (YEAR)

PRE REQUISITE: CHINESE 1 & 2

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**GERMAN 1 (35230)**

The focus is understanding and speaking basic German with an introduction to German culture. Much of the vocabulary will center on topics such as basic conversations; introductions of self, friends, and families; hobbies and interests, weather, school environment, etc.

NO FEE 10<sup>TH</sup>, 11<sup>TH</sup>, OR 12<sup>TH</sup> GRADE 1.0 ELECTIVE CREDIT (YEAR)

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**WSU GRMN 1010 OR GERMAN 2 (35231)**

This course continues to focus on understanding, speaking, reading and writing basic German with additional cultural experiences. Much of the vocabulary will center on topics such as daily routines, food, shopping, clothing, home environment, community, entertainment, celebrations, etc.

Students will continue to develop vocabulary in topics such as relationships, traveling, healthy lifestyles, past events, future plans and careers, etc. with the goal to develop more proficiency in speaking, listening, reading, and writing. Students will continue to learn about German culture. This course will be conducted mostly in German.

WSU CE FEES APPLY 10<sup>TH</sup>, 11<sup>TH</sup> OR 12<sup>TH</sup> GRADE 1.0 LA ELECTIVE CREDIT (YEAR)

PRE-REQUISITE: GERMAN 1 & 2

CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT CREDIT OFFERED THROUGH WEBER STATE. GRMN 1020 – 3 CREDITS

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**WSU GRMN 2010 OR GERMAN 4 (35233)**

This course is a continuation of German III in a variety of new topics. This course will be conducted mostly in German.

WSU CE FEES APPLY 10<sup>TH</sup>, 11<sup>TH</sup> OR 12<sup>TH</sup> GRADE 1.0 LA ELECTIVE CREDIT (YEAR)

PRE-REQUISITE: GERMAN 1, 2 & 3

CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT CREDIT OFFERED THROUGH WEBER STATE. GRMN 2010 – 3 CREDITS

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**WSU GRMN 2010 OR GERMAN 5 PRE AP (35234)**

This course is a continuation of German IV in a variety of new topics. This course will be conducted mostly in German.

WSU CE FEES APPLY 11<sup>TH</sup> OR 12<sup>TH</sup> GRADE 1.0 LA ELECTIVE CREDIT (YEAR)

PRE-REQUISITE: GERMAN 4

CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT CREDIT OFFERED THROUGH WEBER STATE. GRMN 2010 – 3 CREDITS

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**GERMAN AP LANGUAGE AND CULTURE (35235)**

This course will build on the skills learned in German V. There will be a continued emphasis on oral communication, vocabulary, writing, reading, listening, and grammar. Students will explore more German literature and art. Students will continue to learn about and experience German culture. The class will be conducted in German. Students will be preparing for the AP German exam, but will not be required to take it. If the student passes the AP German Exam, 6-9 elective college credits can be earned.

1.0 LA ELECTIVE CREDIT (YEAR)

PRE-REQUISITE: GERMAN 5

**SPANISH 1 (35210)**

This is a beginning course that will focus on learning basic communication, vocabulary, reading, writing, listening, and grammar skills in Spanish. Some of the topics that will be studied: survival words for the classroom, greetings, talking about self, likes and dislikes, family, school life, weather, and hanging out. Hispanic culture will be introduced.

1.0 ELECTIVE CREDIT (YEAR)

**SPANISH 2 (35211)**

Some of the topics that will be studied: daily life, clothing, home, food, entertainment, and celebrations. Students will continue to learn about and experience Hispanic culture. The class will be conducted in Spanish some of the time.

**WSU SPAN 2010 OR SPANISH 4 (35213)**

This course will build on the skills learned in Spanish 3. There will be a continued emphasis on oral communication, vocabulary, writing, reading, listening, and grammar. The main emphasis is listening to native speakers and being able to converse in a meaningful manner. Some of the topics that will be studied: culture and opinions, the arts, recycling, social issues, introduction to technology. Students will explore Hispanic literature. Students will continue to learn about and experience Hispanic culture. The class will be conducted in Spanish most of the time.

### SECONDARY MATH I (62125F)

This will be specifically for those who have struggled with Secondary Math I when it was taken in 9<sup>th</sup> grade. Candidates for this class will be referred by the Junior High Schools. Reasons for failing in 9<sup>th</sup> grade will be reviewed and appropriate placement will be determined for 10<sup>th</sup> grade.

Course will focus on formalizing and extending the mathematics that students learned in the middle grades. The critical areas deepen and extend understanding of linear relationships, by contrasting them with exponential phenomena, and by applying linear models to data that exhibit a linear trend. Students will use properties and theorems involving congruent figures to deepen and extend understanding of geometric knowledge. The final unit in the course ties together the algebraic and geometric ideas studied.

They will reason abstractly and quantitatively while communicating mathematics to others. Students will use appropriate tools, including technology, to model mathematics. **Designed to be taken as a sophomore to provide a foundation for future PE courses.** This course is an individualized, concepts based, one-semester course designed to give students the knowledge and skills necessary to self-asses, create, conduct, evaluate, and redesign personal fitness programs. The course is a combination of classroom and activity based learning activities with a focus on proper nutrition and the mastery of skills and concepts necessary for students to become accomplished monitors of the personal lifetime fitness. Through participation, students will learn to compare the fitness benefits in a variety of individual and team activities. Students will become proficient in the use of a variety of assessments, measurement devices, exercise equipment, web and community resources and computer software, assigned reading and writing assignments which include activity journals and portfolios. This course will broaden the physical education experience and contribute to the literacy of the student. *This course is required for graduation, no substitutions, including participation in athletics.* **May NOT repeat. Only course that fulfills PE Fit4Life graduation credit**

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### **HONORS BIOLOGY (72515)**

An accelerated study of Biology emphasizing preparation for AP Biology. Students interested in a science/medical career should take this class. State Core Test Given.

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### **BIOLOGY-AP (72610)**

An accelerated study of Biology. Emphasis on laboratory experiences and preparation for the Advanced Placement Exam. Accelerated sophomores can be successful in this course but may not be recommended to take the AP exam. State Core Exam will be given to sophomores or any student that has not taken regular Biology. The class is recommended for students interested in a science-related career, such as medical, environmental, etc., or non-science majors trying to fulfill general science requirements.

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### **BIOLOGY: AGRICULTURE SCIENCE (72317)**

Emphasis on agriculture: food, farming, fabric, flowers, and forestry. Students will be cognizant of current technologies, methods and changes in agricultural science. Students will be actively working in a greenhouse environment. This course gives 3<sup>rd</sup> year science credit or Biology credit.

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### **AP CHEMISTRY (72620)**

If students are more interested in medical careers that require 4 year degrees or certificates (RN, RNA, CNA, EMT, etc.) then Chemistry 1110 would be recommended. Students may elect to take AP Test for college credit.

Career opportunities and education preparation are examined. Learning activities will take place in a lab and field trips. This course gives 3<sup>rd</sup> year science credit.

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**PSYCHOLOGY- AP (77630)**

A college level course in psychology where students may elect to take an AP test for college credit.

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**WSU PSYCHOLOGY 1010 (77428)**

WSU Introductory Psychology is a one-semester course designed to expose and familiarize students with the fundamental concepts and principles of what makes us who we are. It surveys the field of psychology and covers topics ranging from the biological basis of behavior to personality, abnormal, and social psychology. The course demonstrates how the issues, methods, and application of psychological research contributes to the body of knowledge that comprises the field of psychology.

#### **EDUCATION 1010 – EXPLORING EDUCATION (23900)**

Students will explore the exciting world of teaching; examine what it means to be a teacher; and participate in field observations. This course is designed to introduce students to personal and professional experiences within the educational community. This course or an approved equivalent, is a prerequisite to elementary and secondary licensure programs in the department of teacher education at Weber State University.

Students must provide their own transportation.

### INTERACTIVE COMPUTER ARTS SOFTWARE & APP DEVELOPMENT (27301)

Using Python® as a primary tool and incorporating multiple platforms and languages for computation. Students will also develop apps for smart phones and tablets. This course aims to develop computational thinking, generate excitement about career paths that utilize computing, and introduce professional tools that foster creativity and collaboration. This course can be a student's first course in computer science. CSE helps students develop programming expertise and explore the workings of the Internet. Projects and problems include app development, visualization of data, cybersecurity, robotics, and simulation. \*Students will be able to take the AP Computer Principles Test (\$92 fee).

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### CS GAME FUNDAMENTALS (27302)

Through project based experience, students gain fundamental knowledge of video game development. These fundamentals include game design, scripting, creation of digital assets, graphical resources, animations, understanding hardware, problem solving, critical thinking, collaboration and project Management.

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### CS DYNAMIC WEB DEVELOPMENT (27303)

This class introduces students to Internet programming and developing Web Applications. This class teaches HTML 5 which is a programming language that is starting to become an industry standard. Students will learn how to make Dynamic Web Pages that will help them in many ways, including making their video games more interactive.

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### INTERACTIVE COMPUTER ARTS APPLICATIONS (27304)

This is an advanced course in computer programming/software engineering and applications. It reviews and builds on the concepts introduced in earlier CS Classes. It Introduces students to dynamic allocation of data, advanced utilization of classes, advanced GUI techniques, and advanced applications of recursion through the application of mathematical concepts. The main programming language will be Java. \*\*Students will be able to take the AP Computer Science A Test (\$92 fee).

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### **INTERACTIVE COMPUTER ARTS ALGORITHMS (27305)**

This course builds on the object-oriented programming principles taught in Computer Programming I and Computer Programming II. A solid understanding of these concepts is assumed and required in this course. This course presents the ideas, tools, structure, syntax, libraries and object-oriented design techniques for developing well-formed data structures. Students study and strengthen their concepts such as problem solving, program structure, classes, methods, data types, control constructs, file and console I/O. Students will also learn other important principles in designing object-oriented programs containing data structures. Students will design and use of common data structures including arrays, tables, hash tables, stacks, queues, linked lists, binary trees, multiway trees, graphs, searching, sorting and the standard template library data structures. Students will program a number of assignments that demonstrate their understanding of these concepts.

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### **APPAREL DESIGN & PRODUCTION II (43127)**

This course introduces students to basic sewing, serger, and pressing equipment and reviews fabric construction on an intermediate level. Students will be able to make an intermediate level project using correct construction techniques. Student leadership (FCCLA) will be an integral part of the course. Experience may include pattern design, surface design, fitting and alteration, custom sewing, home decorating and other entrepreneurial opportunities.

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### **EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN (47310)**

An instructional program that prepares individuals to perform initial medical diagnosis, treatment, and comprehensive care in medical crises, under the general supervision of a coordinating physician. Includes instruction in all aspects of basic healthcare; disease, disorder, and injury symptomology and diagnosis; emergency medical treatment procedures for various injuries and disease outbreaks; basic pharmacology; anesthetics; intravenous and other drug administration procedures; obstetrics procedures; basic surgical techniques; emergency medical equipment operation and maintenance; special care of patients exposed to heat, cold, radiation, or contagious disease; and administrative aspects of emergency medicine. Programs may include emergency vehicle operation and patient transportation procedures, depending on level of training.

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### **INTRO TO PHYSICAL THERAPY (47356)**

For students interested in Physical Therapy. Course includes body movement, physical therapy terms, therapeutic exercises, roles and responsibilities, laws, ethics and insurance. History and current trends are also included.

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**CRIMINAL JUSTICE (77465)**

Designed to give students a basic understanding of the interaction within the community and law enforcement agencies. It introduces history of law enforcement, explores methods & programs designed to enhance community law enforcement relations, mutual understanding, & cooperation in crime control. For those students interested in law enforcement and students desiring General Education credit at WSU.

**PRINCIPLES OF ENGINEERING/ PLTW POE (84410)**

This is a "making and destroying" class! From bridges to robots...this class has it all! Students explore a broad range of engineering, physics and math topics. These encompass mechanisms, the strength of structures and materials, energy, automation of devices and ballistics. Physics and math are applied in practice and through hands-on projects. Collaboration, teamwork and presentation skills are also used. Class is taught at the introductory college level and students may elect to receive concurrent enrollment credit.

**INTRODUCTION TO ENGINEERING (84420)**

This is the first instructional course in a sequence of courses that prepares students to develop technical knowledge and skills required to plan and prepare scale pictorial interpretations of engineering and design concepts. This includes instruction in use of 2D/3D CAD software, sketching, drawing layout, geometric construction, orthographic projection, and dimensioning.

**DIGITAL ELECTRONICS/ PLTW DE (84430)**

Introduces students to applied digital logic, a key element of careers in engineering & engineering technology. This course explores the smart circuits found in watches, calculators, video games, & computers. They design circuits to solve problems, export their designs to a printed circuit auto-routing program that generates printed circuit boards, and use appropriate components to build their designs.

**COMPUTER INTEGRATED MANUFACTURING/ PLTW CIM (84440)**

Teaches the fundamentals of computerized manufacturing technology. It builds on the solid-modeling skills developed in the I.E.D. course. Students use 3-D computer software to solve design problems. They assess their solutions through mass propriety analysis (the relationship of design, function, and materials), modify their designs, and use prototyping equipment to produce 3-D models.

**CIVIL ENGINEERING AND ARCHITECTURE/ PLTW CEA (84450)**

This course provides an overview of the fields of Civil Engineering and architecture, while emphasizing the interrelationship and dependence of both fields on each other. Students use state of the art software to solve real world problems and communicate solutions to hands-on projects and activities.

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**AEROSPACE ENGINEERING/ PLTW AE (84460)**

The major focus of this course is to expose students to the world of aeronautics, flight, and engineering. Students will participate in activity-based, project-based, and problem-based learning. Students should have experience in physics, mathematics, and technology education. Lessons will engage students in engineering design problems related to aerospace information systems, astronautics, rocketry, propulsion, the physics of space science, space life sciences, the biology of space science, principles of aeronautics, structures and materials, and systems engineering.

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**ENGINEERING DESIGN AND DEVELOPMENT/ PLTW EDD (84470)**

An engineering research course in which students work in teams to research, design and construct a solution to an open-ended engineering problem. Students apply principles developed in the four preceding courses and are guided by a community mentor. They must present progress reports, submit a final written report and defend their solutions to a panel of outside reviewers at the end of the course.

Courses offered include: Old Testament, New Testament, D&C, and Book of Mormon. (4 year rotation). Students of any religious affiliation are invited and welcome to attend. Classes are held at the seminary building north of the high school.
