GENERAL REGISTRATION INFORMATION

1. Proper registration is important. It is the responsibility of the student and parent/guardian to check graduation requirements & course descriptions carefully. Counselors are available for consultation.
2. Each student must register for a full eight period schedule for both semesters. Further, students are required to select two alternate classes. After registration, changes must be approved by the parents and the counselor. **A \$10.00 fee will be assessed to change class schedules.**
3. Some classes listed in this course guide may not be offered if minimum enrollment requirements are not met.
4. Students who desire to take religious instruction (release time/bible study) may do so on a non-credit basis.
5. Students desiring early graduation should declare their intent to their counselor immediately to provide adequate planning time.
6. Weber School District and its individual schools will not be responsible for transporting or arranging for the transport of students who elect to take classes at schools other than their own school where they are registered. The parent/guardian of such students will be solely responsible for the transport of their students to and from each school.

FEE SCHEDULE

CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT AND EARLY COLLEGE

EARLY COLLEGE – Application process – must meet with a counselor. Application and agreement forms must be signed by student and parents.

CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT

- If you are a Junior or Senior, possess a desire to seek **challenging, rigorous educational opportunities** for both high school and college credit, then you may be interested in registering for concurrent enrollment credit.
- It is expected that students will have the necessary background and meet the academic requirements to demonstrate success in concurrent enrollment courses. It is required that concurrent enrollment students have at least a **3.0 cumulative GPA. Appropriate exceptions will be handled on a case by case basis.**
- Some institutions may require **minimum ACT or Accuplacer scores** in addition to the minimum 3.0 GPA before enrollment at the university or for specific courses.
- Universities require **90% attendance** or better in all concurrent enrollment courses.
- Students will be responsible to **purchase** any required books, outline, and/or supplies as required by the university.
- All post-secondary institutions charge a **one-time application fee**. Payment of this fee is the responsibility of the student.
- Dropping a concurrent enrollment course is not advisable. If you choose to drop the course after the university deadline, a "W" will be given on your permanent college transcript and may affect your future college endeavors.
- The **grade** you earn in any concurrent enrollment course will become part of your **permanent high school transcript as well as your college transcript.**
- **College credit** for concurrent enrollment is not guaranteed from year to year. It is determined by the university as to which courses and instructors qualify to offer the credit.

Please check with the CTE Coordinator or your counselor if you have any questions regarding concurrent enrollment courses and the status of the class. It is important to remember that concurrent enrollment should be in line with your CCR, college, and career goals.

Please note the possibility that some CE classes offered at the time of printing the course guide may not end up being eligible for CE Credit at a later date. A class may be eligible for Concurrent Enrollment pending curriculum and instructor approval by post-secondary institutions and the course being included on the USOE Concurrent Enrollment Master List. This approval is granted on a year-to-year basis.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS: 1.0 LA10, 1.0 LA11, 1.0 LA4 (ELECTIVE) CREDITS

ENROLL IN ENGLISH EACH YEAR OF HIGH SCHOOL. BEGINNING IN THE TENTH GRADE, ENGLISH ELECTIVES MAY BE TAKEN FOR THE 12TH GRADE ENGLISH REQUIREMENT.

ENGLISH 10 CP (52510)

Designed to help students improve basic English skills (reading, writing, speaking, listening).

NO FEE 10TH GRADE 1.0 LA10 CREDIT (YEAR)

ENGLISH 10 HONORS (52610)

A survey of World Literature highlighting cultural similarities and differences. Focus is on analytical reading and writing. Generally, two pieces read per term and corresponding papers written. Access to and use of a computer are imperative.

NO FEE 10TH GRADE 1.0 LA10 CREDIT (YEAR)

PRE-REQUISITE: TEACHER APPROVAL

ENGLISH 11 CP (52520)

Designed to help students improve basic English skills (reading, writing, speaking, listening). Emphasis on American literature. Some ACT preparation included.

NO FEE 11TH GRADE 1.0 LA11 CREDIT (YEAR)

ENGLISH 11 HONORS (52620)

Focus on analytical reading of classic American literature and writing. Generally, two pieces read per term and a variety of papers written. Access to and use of a computer is imperative. Some ACT preparation included.

NO FEE 11TH GRADE 1.0 LA11 CREDIT (YEAR)

PRE-REQUISITE: TEACHER APPROVAL

ENGLISH 11 – AP ENGLISH LANGUAGE (52627)

Engages students in becoming skilled readers of texts and in becoming skilled writers who compose for a variety of purposes. Both their writing and their reading should make students aware of the interactions among a writer's purposes, audience expectations, and subjects, as well as the way English language conventions contribute to the effectiveness of writing. Emphasis on informational text and non-fiction.

APPROX. \$92 FOR THE SPRING AP TEST 11TH GRADE 1.0 LA11 CREDIT (YEAR)

ENGLISH 12 CP (52530)

Designed to help students improve basic English skills (reading, writing, speaking, listening). Writing emphasis for effective college and workplace communication. Some British literature will be covered.

NO FEE 12TH GRADE 1.0 LA ELECTIVE CREDIT (YEAR)

AP ENGLISH LITERATURE AND COMPOSITION (52630)

An AP English Literature and Composition course engages students in the careful reading and critical analysis of imaginative literature. Through the close reading of selected texts, students deepen their understanding of the ways writers use language to provide both meaning and pleasure for their readers. As they read, students consider a work's structure, style and themes, as well as such smaller-scale elements as the use of figurative language, imagery, symbolism and tone.

APPROX. \$92 FOR THE SPRING AP TEST 12TH GRADE 1.0 LA ELECTIVE CREDIT (YEAR)

JOURNALISM (52240)

A rigorous full year newspaper production class wherein students work with an advisor to create a competition-worthy school newspaper. In this course, students will gain journalism skills such as: interviewing, writing, editing, layout design, photography, ad sales, as well as caption and headline writing. They will use these skills as they produce the school newspaper. Because of the production nature of the class, expectations are high and deadlines are strict.

NO FEE 10TH, 11TH OR 12TH GRADES 1.0 LA ELECTIVE CREDIT (YEAR)

SPEECH & DEBATE 1 (52270)

Fundamentals of communication, debate, oratory, and beginning public speaking.

SPEECH & DEBATE 2 (52370)

Continuation of Speech and Debate I. Possible Team competition.

AUDITION IS REQUIRED PRIOR TO REGISTRATION.

MUSIC-AP (32620)

Study of composing, harmonizing, and writing music. Preparation for the AP test; which, if students pass, they may earn college credit. Proficiency on an instrument or voice is required. Must have knowledge of basic music theory, including scales, key signatures, and basic rhythms.

FEE \$15 PLUS AP TEST FEE 10TH, 11TH OR 12TH GRADE 1.0 FINE ARTS CREDIT (YEAR)

ORCHESTRA (32274)

Open to students with previous orchestra or private lesson experience. This course is designed to enhance the playing abilities of all BHS string players. The orchestra will participate in various concerts, festivals, and graduation. We will perform various styles of music and will cover basic music theory.

1.0 FINE ARTS CREDIT (YEAR)

SYMPHONIC BAND – LAKER BAND (32275)

Open to any students wishing to participate in a band class. Symphonic Band encompasses all the band activities at BHS including pep band, various concerts, festivals, and graduation. The band will perform various styles of music and will cover basic music theory.

Open to students by audition and instrumentation needs. Wind Ensemble also participates in all of the band activities at BHS including pep band, various concerts, festivals, and graduation. The band will perform various styles of music and will cover basic music theory.

10TH, 11TH, OR 12TH GRADE

1.0 FINE ARTS CREDIT (YEAR)

AUDITION IS REQUIRED PRIOR TO REGISTRATION.

DRUMLINE (AUDITION)

This is an audition group. Joining the percussion class does not guarantee entrance to this course. Drumline students will be required to attend band camp in the summer to prepare for fall activities. After school and before school rehearsals are required at various times throughout the year.

GUITAR BEGINNING (32290)

For students interested in learning the basics of guitar performance. Students will learn to read traditional music notation, be introduced to tablature notation, learn basic chords, and perform for peers in class. Classical music as well as pop and country music will be used in the course. This Course will cover the beginning concepts and will be best suited to those with little or no guitar experience. Guitars are NOT provided by the school, but can be rented from a local music store. Only acoustic guitars are allowed. No electric guitars may be used.

0.5 FINE ARTS CREDIT (SEM)

PRE-REQUISITE: THEATRE II

AUDITION IS REQUIRED PRIOR TO REGISTRATION.

TECH THEATRE (32355)

Foundation and core of theatre knowledge including: structure of theatre (stage house, auditorium, peripheral areas), equipment (lighting, sound, construction), and analysis of backstage practices as well as onstage choices. Students will support all activities scheduled in the school's theatre space. Students are required to work one of the two large main stage productions in addition to their after school hours. After school time will be required (approximately 20 hours per quarter). Students are expected to attend theatre performances outside of regularly scheduled class time and may be required to pay for these events.

10TH, 11TH, OR 12TH GRADE

1.0 FINE ARTS CREDIT (YEAR)

PRE-REQUISITE: TEACHER SIGNATURE REQUIRED

FILM STUDIES (32266)

Film Studies is a survey of cinema from the beginning of the art form through today. We will study all aspects of film making, history, and standards by watching, writing and verbally analyzing films from the past and present. Students should expect to leave the class with a strong knowledge of the art form of film and be able to express verbally and in writing quality analysis of the art form. Our discussions and assignments will naturally bleed into an understanding of all art forms, visual, performing etc. Students may be expected to attend film showings outside of regularly scheduled class time and may be required to pay for admission to these events.

FEE: POSSIBLE ADMISSION FEES

10TH, 11TH OR 12TH GRADES

0.5 FINE ARTS CREDIT (SEM)

VISUAL ART COURSES**ART FOUNDATIONS (32210)**

This is a basic art class. It is designed to provide an overview and introduction to the Visual Arts using a variety of art tools and materials. There is an emphasis on teaching the basic elements and principles of art. With an emphasis on making art, this course is designed to develop higher-level thinking, art-related thinking skills, art criticism, art history, and aesthetics. *No pre-requisite. This class should be taken before Painting and Drawing, or Sculpture.*

0.5 FINE ARTS CREDIT (SEM)

PAINTING AND DRAWING (32216)

Art students refine drawing & painting skills through a series of projects and mediums designed to teach technique and mastery. Students should have taken the Foundations Art class in either junior high or high school or be comfortable with basic drawing skills before taking this class. May Repeat.

PRE-REQUISITE: ART FOUNDATIONS **OR** ART AND DESIGN**ART-AP (32610) INCLUDING AP DRAWING, AP 2-D DESIGN, AND STUDIO ART**

This is an advanced class for students to continue to develop their art skills. Advanced drawing, painting, and design. (may include computer graphics) Individual projects. Must complete portfolio for college credit.

Sculpture 1 is a basic level class that explores creating three-dimensional art using a variety of materials. Students will create primarily with clay, but they will also explore plaster, wire, paper, and other media.

PRE-REQUISITE: ART FOUNDATIONS OR ART AND GRAPHIC DESIGN

APPLIED ARTS – COMMERCIAL ARTS (FINE ARTS OR CTE CREDIT)**ART AND DESIGN (32310)**

Basic drawing, design, color & typography skills. Intro to computer graphic programs Photoshop & Illustrator. (Formerly named: Design & Visual Communications – Des & Vis)

FEE \$20 10TH, 11TH OR 12TH GRADES 0.5 FINE ARTS OR CTE CREDIT (SEM)

COMMERCIAL AND ADVERTISING ART (32311)

Advanced graphic design and illustration. Emphasis on using Photoshop, Illustrator, and InDesign for producing original graphic arts. Also includes a variety of traditional mediums. (May Repeat).

FEE \$20 10TH, 11TH OR 12TH GRADES 0.5 FINE ARTS OR CTE CREDIT (SEM)

PRE-REQUISITE: ART AND DESIGN

FOREIGN LANGUAGE

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS: NOT REQUIRED FOR GRADUATION

Students who are college-bound will want to complete two years of the same world language as recommended by the universities. University of Utah requires two years of world language for admissions.

AMERICAN SIGN LANGUAGE 1 (35300)

A hands-on class that develops communication skills in American Sign Language. Students will learn how to communicate with a deaf person in a variety of situations, and will learn about deaf culture and history. Classes are conducted in American Sign Language, with a high emphasis on expressive skills.

NO FEE 10TH, 11TH, OR 12TH GRADE 1.0 ELECTIVE CREDIT (YEAR)

AMERICAN SIGN LANGUAGE 2 (35301)

This is an immersive conversation-based language class utilizing interactive contexts based on real-life every day conversation. We will build on the Level 1 vocabulary by utilizing it in more complex conversations. There will be several individual as well as partner projects. Cultural-appropriateness and developing more advanced communicative skills are a feature of this class. In order to achieve these goals, mandatory voice-off periods will be a common occurrence in the class.

NO FEE 11TH OR 12TH GRADE 1.0 ELECTIVE CREDIT (YEAR)

PRE REQUISITE: ASL 1

AMERICAN SIGN LANGUAGE 3 (35302)

This is an intensive conversation-based sign language class with greater opportunities for being involved in the Deaf Community. This is a "college-prep" / "career-prep" course where the ultimate goal is to consider interpreting as a career/Deaf education major. In order to achieve these goals, mandatory voice-off periods will be a common occurrence in the class.

NO FEE 12TH GRADE 1.0 ELECTIVE CREDIT (YEAR)

PRE-REQUISITE: ASL 1 & 2

CHINESE 1 (35260)

The focus is on speaking and understanding basic Chinese with an introduction to Chinese culture. The students will be able to communicate in topics such as self-introduction, ordering in restaurants, inquiring directions, etc. The goal is to promote professional, cultural and social development through a modern linguistic methodology.

NO FEE 10TH, 11TH, OR 12TH GRADE 1.0 ELECTIVE CREDIT (YEAR)

CHINESE 2 (35261)

This course continues to focus on speaking and understanding basic Chinese with additional cultural experiences. The students will be able to express their opinions about entertainment, food, lifestyles, etc. The goal is to promote professional, cultural, and social development through a modern linguistic methodology.

NO FEE 11TH OR 12TH GRADE 1.0 ELECTIVE CREDIT (YEAR)

PRE REQUISITE: CHINESE 1

CHINESE 3 (35262)

This course continues to focus on speaking and understanding Chinese with additional cultural experiences. Students will be able to discuss topics such as traveling, fairy tales, traditional philosophy, etc. The goal is to promote professional, cultural and social development through a modern linguistic methodology.

NO FEE 12TH GRADE 1.0 ELECTIVE CREDIT (YEAR)

PRE REQUISITE: CHINESE 1 & 2

GERMAN 1 (35230)

The focus is understanding and speaking basic German with an introduction to German culture. Much of the vocabulary will center on topics such as basic conversations; introductions of self, friends, and families; hobbies and interests, weather, school environment, etc.

Students will be preparing for the AP German exam, but will not be required to take it. If the student passes the AP German Exam, 6-9 elective college credits can be earned.

MATHEMATICS

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS: 3.0 CREDITS (MA1, MA2, MA3)

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT COLLEGE BOUND STUDENTS TAKE MATH EVERY YEAR IN HIGH SCHOOL. COURSES ARE LISTED IN RECOMMENDED SEQUENCE.

SECONDARY MATH I (62125)

This will be specifically for those who have struggled with Secondary Math I when it was taken in 9th grade. Candidates for this class will be referred by the Junior High Schools. Reasons for failing in 9th grade will be reviewed and appropriate placement will be determined for 10th grade.

Course will focus on formalizing and extending the mathematics that students learned in the middle grades. The critical areas deepen and extend understanding of linear relationships, by contrasting them with exponential phenomena, and by applying linear models to data that exhibit a linear trend. Students will use properties and theorems involving congruent figures to deepen and extend understanding of geometric knowledge. The final unit in the course ties together the algebraic and geometric ideas studied.

Finally, students will merge their experiences with functions and geometry to create models and solve contextual problems. The honors course will finish the pre-calculus content that was started in Sec Math Honors I and II.

GRAPHING CALCULATOR HIGHLY RECOMMENDED

COLLEGE PREP MATH (62315)

College Prep Math formalizes and reinforces concepts from the Secondary Mathematics series to provide students with the foundational skills and understanding prerequisite to College Algebra (1050). Students will reason abstractly and quantitatively while solving linear and quadratic equations and linear inequalities. They will efficiently use polynomial and rational expressions and functions, radicals and complex numbers, and exponential and logarithmic expressions and functions to model and solve mathematical problems. They will explore conic sections and represent parabolic data. Throughout this course, students will make sense of problems and persevere in solving them, using tools strategically, and attend to precision.

NO FEE 12TH GRADE 1.0 MATH CREDIT (YEAR)

PRE-REQUISITE: COMPLETION OF ALL SECONDARY COURSES AND SEC MATH III WITH A C OR BETTER

PRE-CALCULUS (62549)

A rigorous course covering Trig and Algebra skills needed for AP Calculus and (AP Stats). The main goal is for students to gain a deep understanding of the fundamental concepts and relationships of functions. Students will expand their knowledge of quadratic, exponential, and logarithmic functions to include power, polynomial, rational, piece-wise, and trigonometric functions. Students will investigate and explore mathematical ideas, develop multiple strategies for analyzing complex situations. Students will analyze various representations of functions, sequences, and series.

NO FEE 12TH GRADE 1.0 MATH CREDIT (YEAR)

PRE-REQUISITE: COMPLETION OF ALL SECONDARY COURSES AND SEC MATH III WITH A B OR BETTER



DIXIE MATH 1010 (62567)

This course is intended to prepare students for college level math courses. It will provide a strong algebraic foundation for any higher level math courses that the student may need. Int Algebra (Math 1010) provides the necessary background for Math 1030 Quantitative Reasoning, Math 1040 Statistics, Math 1050 College Algebra, and Math 1090 College Algebra for Business Students. This course will **not** satisfy math course requirements for the Regent's Scholarship.

The course includes mathematical decision making in finance, modeling, probability and statistics, and making choices. ***Each quarter of instruction is independent of one another.*** Students will make sense of authentic problems and persevere in solving them. They will reason abstractly and quantitatively while communicating mathematics to others. Students will use appropriate tools, including technology, to model mathematics. Students will use structure and regularity of reasoning to describe mathematical situations and solve problems.

NO FEE 11TH OR 12TH GRADE 0.5 OR 1.0 MATH CREDIT (SEM OR YEAR)

ACCOUNTING I (28230)

Do you like money? Are you thinking of owning your own business? This is the class for you. Basic elements and concepts of double-entry accounting for business & personal use will be covered including procedures for handling cash and financial reports.

Designed to be taken as a sophomore to provide a foundation for future PE courses. This course is an individualized, concepts based, one-semester course designed to give students the knowledge and skills necessary to self-asses, create, conduct, evaluate, and redesign personal fitness programs. The course is a combination of classroom and activity based learning activities with a focus on proper nutrition and the mastery of skills and concepts necessary for students to become accomplished monitors of the personal lifetime fitness. Through participation, students will learn to compare the fitness benefits in a variety of individual and team activities. Students will become proficient in the use of a variety of assessments, measurement devices, exercise equipment, web and community resources and computer software, assigned reading and writing assignments which include activity journals and portfolios. This course will broaden the physical education experience and contribute to the literacy of the student. *This course is required for graduation, no substitutions, including participation in athletics.* **May NOT repeat. Only course that fulfills PE Fit4Life graduation credit**

This course will emphasize lifetime physical fitness through sports and games. **Completion of PE/Fitness for Life prior to taking this course is highly recommended.**

Students must participate/complete the prescribed workout during each class period to receive credit for the class. Most of this course is dedicated to teaching students how to lift weights, develop free-weight workouts, and become comfortable using free weights and their corresponding lifting techniques in various capacities through hands-on participation. There will be times, during the course, that will be dedicated to conditioning with respect to running or aerobic training. However, the mainstay of this course's focus is on lifting weights. Students who are unwilling to dress in gym clothes and/or participate in weight-lifting should not take this class.

10TH, 11TH, OR 12TH GRADE

0.5 PE CREDIT (SEM)

ADVANCED CONDITIONING (73236)

This PE course is for those students who have successfully completed PE/Fitness for Life and Conditioning I.

A continuation of the PE / Conditioning course philosophy and requirements with more advanced lifts and techniques. Student will begin to develop their own workout programs, learn how to periodization and adjust their workout throughout the different cycles of training while still maintaining an overall balanced program that focuses on aerobic, anaerobic and resistance training strategies. Students who are unwilling to dress in gym clothes and/or participate in weight-lifting should not take this class.

Student-athletes will be involved in strength training, conditioning, agility, and all around general fitness to help minimize injury and improve overall performance.

SCIENCE

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS: 3.0 CREDITS

BIOLOGY (72215)

Study of organisms and how they interact, how life has changed over time, and the structure and function of living things. State Core Test Given.

FEE \$10 10TH, 11TH, OR 12TH GRADE 1.0 SCIENCE CREDIT (YEAR)

HONORS BIOLOGY (72515)

An accelerated study of Biology emphasizing preparation for AP Biology. Students interested in a science/medical career should take this class. State Core Test Given.

FEE \$10 10TH, 11TH, OR 12TH GRADE 1.0 SCIENCE CREDIT (YEAR)

BIOLOGY-AP (72610)

An accelerated study of Biology. Emphasis on laboratory experiences and preparation for the Advanced Placement Exam. Accelerated sophomores can be successful in this course but may not be recommended to take the AP exam. State Core Exam will be given to sophomores or any student that has not taken regular Biology. The class is recommended for students interested in a science-related career, such as medical, environmental, etc., or non-science majors trying to fulfill general science requirements.

FEE \$90 AP TEST 11TH, OR 12TH GRADE 1.0 SCIENCE CREDIT (YEAR)

BIOLOGY: AGRICULTURE SCIENCE (72317)

Emphasis on agriculture: food, farming, fabric, flowers, and forestry. Students will be cognizant of current technologies, methods and changes in agricultural science. Students will be actively working in a greenhouse environment. This course gives 3rd year science credit or Biology credit.

FEE \$10 10TH, 11TH, OR 12TH GRADE 1.0 SCIENCE OR CTE CREDIT (YEAR)

CHEMISTRY (72520)

Study of the structure and behavior of matter focusing on chemical reactions and predicting the behavior of matter. Students will gain a greater understanding of the periodic table and how it can be used to make predictions and assumptions. Students will also gain a better understanding of acids, bases, electrochemistry, and nuclear reactions. Emphasis on lab and hands on experiences. State Core Test Given

FEE \$10 10TH, 11TH, OR 12TH GRADE 1.0 SCIENCE CREDIT (YEAR)

HONORS CHEMISTRY (72525)

An accelerated study of the structure and behavior of matter through classroom lecture, labs, and activities. Students will also be expected to complete an independent scientific research project related to chemistry concepts. Students will gain a greater understanding of the periodic table and how it can be used to make predictions and assumptions. Students will also gain a better understanding of acids, bases, electrochemistry, nuclear reactions, and the origin of matter. State Core Test Given.

FEE \$10 10TH, 11TH, OR 12TH GRADE 1.0 SCIENCE CREDIT (YEAR)

PRE-REQUISITE: COMPLETED OR ENROLLED IN SEC MATH III

AP CHEMISTRY (72620)

College level course in the study of structure and behavior of matter. This course will build upon principles taught in General and Honors Chemistry. This course is highly recommended for students that are seriously considering a future in the medical field (MD, DDS, Pharmacist, etc.) or science field. If students are more interested in medical careers that require 4 year degrees or certificates (RN, RNA, CNA, EMT, etc.) then Chemistry 1110 would be recommended. Students may elect to take AP Test for college credit.

FEE: AP TEST 11TH OR 12TH GRADE 1.0 SCIENCE CREDIT (YEAR)

PRE-REQUISITE: CHEMISTRY OR HONORS CHEMISTRY; COMPLETED OR ENROLLED IN SEC MATH III

**WSU CHEMISTRY 1110 (72232)**

This course is a general education requirement in physical science. It does not require an extensive background in chemistry. Recommended for students pursuing a specific careers in the medical field; namely RN, RNA, EMT, CNA, etc. If students are considering medical careers that require graduate schools (MD, DDS, Pharmacist, etc.) then AP Chemistry would be recommended.

PRE-REQUISITE: ENROLLED IN OR COMPLETED SEC MATH III

The following courses count for High School 3rd year Science Elective credit, but **MIGHT NOT COUNT** as 3rd Year Science Credit for some college admissions

ANIMAL SCIENCE I (84217)

Students will be exposed to animal science and technology principles which include genetics, anatomy, physiology/nutrition, diseases, pests, and management practices. The scientific processes of observation, measurement, hypothesizing, data gathering, interpretation, analysis, and application are stressed. Dissecting will be part of the class. Career opportunities and education preparation are examined. Learning activities will take place in a lab and field trips. This course gives 3rd year science credit.

FEE \$10 10TH, 11TH OR 12TH GRADE 1.0 CTE OR SCI ELECTIVE CREDIT (YEAR)

MEDICAL ANATOMY AND PHYSIOLOGY (47380)

MAP is a course designed for future health care professionals. It provides students with an in-depth study of health science careers, anatomy & physiology, and disease/disorders. Hands-on activities will include dissections, clay muscles, and bone identification.

FEE \$10.00 11TH OR 12TH GRADE 1.0 CTE OR 3RD YR SCI ELECT CREDIT (YEAR)

PRE REQUISITE: INTRO TO HEALTH SCIENCE

PSYCHOLOGY B (77435)

Research in psychology, abnormal behavior, therapy, developmental psychology, body & behavior, cognition, and social psychology. May be taken with or without and before or after Psychology A.

No FEE 10TH, 11TH OR 12TH GRADE 0.5 ELECTIVE CREDIT (SEM)

PSYCHOLOGY- AP (77630)

A college level course in psychology where students may elect to take an AP test for college credit.

FEE APPROX \$90 AP TEST 10TH, 11TH OR 12TH GRADE 1.0 ELECTIVE CREDIT (YEAR)

RECOMMENDED THAT SOPHOMORES HAVE AT LEAST 3.8 GPA

**WSU PSYCHOLOGY 1010 (77428)**

PSYCH1010 is a one-semester course designed to expose and familiarize students with the fundamental concepts and principles of what makes us who we are. It surveys the field of psychology and covers topics ranging from the biological basis of behavior to personality, abnormal, and social psychology. The course demonstrates how the issues, methods, and application of psychological research contributes to the body of knowledge that comprises the field of psychology.

FEE: WSU CE FEE APPLIES 11TH OR 12TH GRADE 0.5 ELECTIVE CREDIT (SEM)

CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT OFFERED THROUGH WEBER STATE. PSY 1010 SS – 3 CREDITS

PRE-REQUISITE: 3.7 OR HIGHER GPA

CURRENT EVENTS (77330)

Class will focus on recent events locally, regionally, nationally and globally that affect our lives politically, socially, militarily and economically...Events today that will be in the history books of tomorrow.

NO FEE 11TH OR 12TH GRADE 0.5 ELECTIVE CREDIT (SEM)

CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION (CTE)

GRADUATION REQUIREMENT: 1.0 CREDIT

AGRICULTURAL SCIENCES EDUCATION

BIOLOGY: AGRICULTURE SCIENCE (72317)

Emphasis on agriculture: food, farming, fabric, flowers, and forestry. Students will be cognizant of current technologies, methods and changes in agricultural science. Students will be actively working in a greenhouse environment. This course gives 3rd year science credit or Biology credit.

FEE \$10

10TH, 11TH, OR 12TH GRADE

1.0 SCIENCE OR CTE CREDIT (YEAR)

ANIMAL SCIENCE (84217)

Students will be exposed to animal science and technology principles which include genetics, anatomy, physiology/nutrition, diseases, pests, and management practices. PRE-REQUISITE: ANIMAL SCIENCE I

FLORICULTURE & GREENHOUSE MANAGEMENT (84327)

Students will develop knowledge and skills related to the floriculture industry. Floral design and greenhouse operations and management will be the primary units of study. Students will be prepared to create floral arrangements, produce commercial plant species in a controlled environment, and manage commercial and experimental greenhouse operations.

FEE \$10

11TH, OR 12TH GRADE

1.0 CTE CREDIT (YEAR)

APPLIED ARTS – COMMERCIAL ARTS

BASIC DIGITAL PHOTOGRAPHY (32248)

This is a basic photography class covering the complete overview of photography. This course will cover the history of photography and the basic concepts of the digital camera, including image capture, editing, and image output. Students will also learn the basics of the Photoshop. *A digital camera is a mandatory requirement for this course. No cell phone cameras or PDA's may be used.*

FEE \$15 10TH, 11TH OR 12TH GRADES .05 CTE CREDIT (SEM)

ADVANCED COMMERCIAL DIGITAL PHOTOGRAPHY (32249)

This is an advanced class that covers the professional advanced techniques of Photoshop, as well as advanced Photography concepts. Emphasis is directed towards career related opportunities and the development of professional work and knowledge of the digital process. *A digital camera is a mandatory requirement for this course. No cell phone cameras or PDA's may be used.*

FEE \$15 10TH, 11TH, OR 12TH GRADES .05 CTE OR CREDIT (SEM)

PRE-REQUISITE: BASIC DIGITAL PHOTOGRAPHY

ART AND GRAPHIC DESIGN (32310)

Do you see yourself as a Graphic Designer? In this class students will design, illustrate and advertise as an introduction to the many opportunities available in the Graphic Design industry. It includes the use of a computer lab and instruction in Adobe Photoshop and Illustrator. We will be doing projects such as logo design, [Illustrations](#), silk screen t-shirts, etc. Students will receive CTE skills certification after successful completion of this course and passing the state exam.

FEE \$15 10TH, 11TH OR 12TH GRADES 0.5 FINE ARTS OR CTE CREDIT (SEM)

COMMERCIAL AND ADVERTISING ART (32311)

Advanced graphic design and illustration. Emphasis on using Photoshop, Illustrator, and InDesign for producing original graphic arts. Also includes a variety of traditional mediums. (May Repeat).

FEE \$15 10TH, 11TH OR 12TH GRADES 0.5 FINE ARTS OR CTE CREDIT (SEM)

PRE-REQUISITE: ART AND GRAPHIC DESIGN

DIGITAL MEDIA 1A: DESIGN & DEVELOPMENT (28387)

This is an introduction into the Digital Media world through the creation of interactive projects. The student will learn the use of text, graphics, animation, audio, video and digital photo editing with Adobe Photoshop, Illustrator, Premiere Pro, Audition, and Flash. Excellent for students with interest in computer, entertainment and media careers.

NO FEE 10TH, 11TH, OR 12TH GRADE 0.5 CTE CREDIT (SEM)

DIGITAL MEDIA 1B: DESIGN & DEVELOPMENT (28388)

This is a continuation of Digital Media 1A. The student will further explore the use of text, graphics, animation, audio, video and digital photo editing with Adobe Photoshop, Illustrator, Premiere Pro, Audition, and Flash. Excellent for students with interest in computer, entertainment and media careers.

TELEVISION BROADCASTING I (SPORTS BROADCASTING- 32255)

EXPLORING COMPUTER SCIENCE (27208)

This course is designed to introduce students to the breadth of the field of computer science through an exploration of engaging and accessible topics. Rather than focusing the entire course on learning particular software tools or programming languages, the course is designed to focus the conceptual ideas of computing and help students understand why certain tools or languages might be utilized to solve particular problems. This is a fun class with hands-on activities and assignments that every student will enjoy. **This course fulfills the REQUIRED Computer Technology credit for graduation.**

PRE-REQUISITE: SEC MATH I

COMPUTER TECHNOLOGY (28220)

Class will include word processing, spreadsheets, presentations, e-mail, Internet use, digital citizenship, file management, basic computer functions, and operating systems. Students should be competent with typing skills prior to class (we will spend a little time on building accuracy and speed). **This class fulfills the REQUIRED Comp Tech credit for graduation.**

Basic programming class for students with little or no programming experience. Using Visual Basic .NET, students will learn the basics of programming and algorithms, good programming style and form.

Using Java, students will work on intermediate programming topics to gain a better understanding of object-oriented programming, software design and computer applications. This class will either fill .50 of CTE or .50 of 3rd year of math.

LAW ENFORCEMENT (77460)

Covers the theories, principles, and techniques of developing, administering, and managing services for the safety and protection of citizens and property. A detailed look at the court system, corrections, and law enforcement agencies.

CRIMINAL JUSTICE 1010 (77466)

A complete study of the criminal justice system, including: courts, corrections, and law enforcement. The class will study how each of these systems impacts our daily lives. The students will be exposed to guest speakers, a field trip to the Utah State Prison, and a court room. The class is approved by the NCAA Clearinghouse.

This includes instruction in use of 2D/3D CAD software, sketching, drawing layout, geometric construction, orthographic projection, and dimensioning.

CAD/ARCHITECTURAL DESIGN I (84320)

This is the first instructional course in a sequence of courses that prepares individuals with knowledge of residential architectural and related construction. This course includes instruction in architectural blueprint reading, sketching, residential floor plans, exterior elevations and the use of CAD software.

Projects and problems include app development, visualization of data, cybersecurity, robotics, and simulation. *Students will be able to take the AP Computer Principles Test (\$92 fee).

It Introduces students to dynamic allocation of data, advanced utilization of classes, advanced GUI techniques, and advanced applications of recursion through the application of mathematical concepts. The main programming language will be Java. **Students will be able to take the AP Computer Science A Test (\$92 fee).

Collaboration, teamwork and presentation skills are also used. Class is taught at the introductory college level and students may elect to receive concurrent enrollment credit.

They design circuits to solve problems, export their designs to a printed circuit auto-routing program that generates printed circuit boards, and use appropriate components to build their designs.

They assess their solutions through mass propriety analysis (the relationship of design, function, and materials), modify their designs, and use prototyping equipment to produce 3-D models.

Students should have experience in physics, mathematics, and technology education. Lessons will engage students in engineering design problems related to aerospace information systems, astronautics, rocketry, propulsion, the physics of space science, space life sciences, the biology of space science, principles of aeronautics, structures and materials, and systems engineering.
